## Black Country Society AGM June 9th 2021



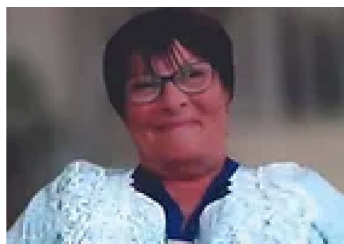
