## Website report

The Black Country Society website remains a keyway for members of the public and the Society to engage with the work of the BCS and is the first port of call for people interested in the BCS. During the last four years Brian Ridout has completely redesigned and improved the website, which now has a variety of articles, images and resources available to all, including a fully searchable index of past issues of the *Blackcountryman*, an online shop, events pages and much more. Since the last AGM Brian also completed the huge task of scanning and uploading all past issues of the *Blackcountryman* into the Member's Area. Much credit should go to Brian for his hard work.

Brian's sad and unexpected passing highlighted his point in his 2021 AGM report, that more help will be needed with administration of the website in the future which Dr Simon Briercliffe is leading on from the BCS Committee. We are extremely grateful to Professor Chris Baker who stepped in at short notice to take on temporary management of the site, including learning the software from scratch, and to Andrew Homer who has worked as liaison with the committee and in identifying issues which needed a solution. Between them they have identified and fixed a number of glitches, including in the shop section. He has also begun to look at ways to improve the website from the user's point of view.
